Mindshifting: Mastering Your Resourceful Brain

Join our course to explore how our minds can lead us to feel powerless and discover techniques to unlock our natural resourcefulness. We will examine how quick decisions can trigger flight, fight, or freeze responses, emphasizing critical thinking, innovation, and collaboration. Participants will learn to reset their minds to enhance executive function and perseverance for themselves and others.

Key Habits Developed:

- Motivation
- Grit and perseverance
- Creative and critical thinking
- Executive function and self-regulation
- Social emotional intelligence
- Constructive vs. destructive mindsets

Core Concepts and Techniques:

- Understanding limbic and higher-order brain functions
- Managing flight, fight, freeze reactions
- Simplifying problem-solving with habits and fluencies
- The role of mirror neurons
- Exploring the prefrontal cortex and higher-order thinking The course runs 5/20-6/10/25 includes 6 live sessions (12 hours total), practice and reflection exercises (5 hours), and lesson plan creation (3 hours) for a comprehensive 20-hour experience.

NYS Teacher Centers partner with PBS to create the Regents Review 2.0 program developed by teachers, a series of thirteen 1hour programs offering NY students help with Regents Exam preparation. The program examines content and demonstrates strategies to reinforce skills necessary in preparing students for these exams. This year, Biology is being added to the series. For each Regents exam there is a one-hour long exam review video. Some of the videos are also broken into shorter clips for those looking for help with a particular topic.
