



Camelot



BOCES—A Unique Education



The Blizzard of '77

The Blizzard of '77 not only paralyzed business and traffic operations throughout the Niagara Frontier, but also affected the daily routines of the students and faculty at Kenmore East. The blizzard conditions and ten foot drifts made roads impassable and knocked down power lines. Temperatures of negative ten degrees coupled with winds of sixty m.p.h. which effected a chill factor of fifty below caused a natural gas shortage that closed our school for a record twelve days in four weeks. 



If you fit these descriptions, then you can be considered the average Kenmore East student in the year 1977.











Driver Ed Stresses Defensive Driving

The curriculum includes exposure to perceptual and decision making techniques, highway environments, night driving and emergency evasive maneuvers.






Trends in Social Studies



General courses in these same areas along with a group of half-year electives provide an opportunity for everyone to take science subjects for general background information.






Mathematics Dept. is Flexible



Research Room Provides Aid



The Work-Study Program provides an ideal opportunity for high school seniors to complete their curriculum while earning a meaningful income and gaining valuable work experience.

Specifically, the program provides the following:

- 1. Knowledge of how to best prepare for a job.
- 2. Excellent opportunity to meet and to work with adults.
- 3. Real on-the-job training.
- 4. Extra credit for your work experience which counts toward graduation.
- 5. Information on how to hold a job after graduation.
- 6. Opportunity to be hired permanently.

Gym Every Other Day




AFS Offers Varied Activities.



Creative Writing Club












Volleyball Wins Section VI Title




















