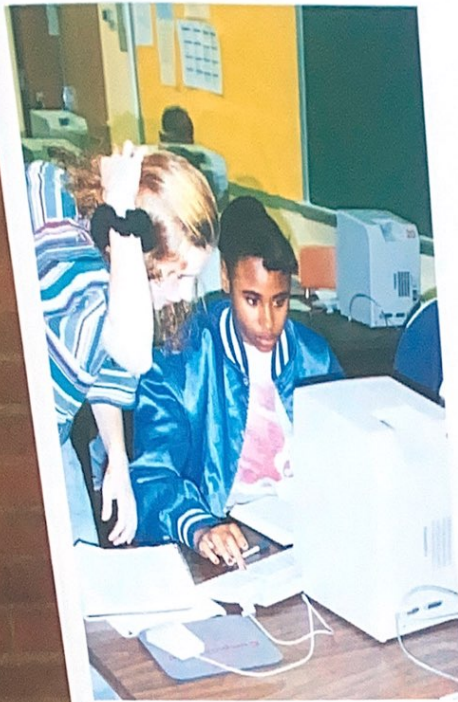

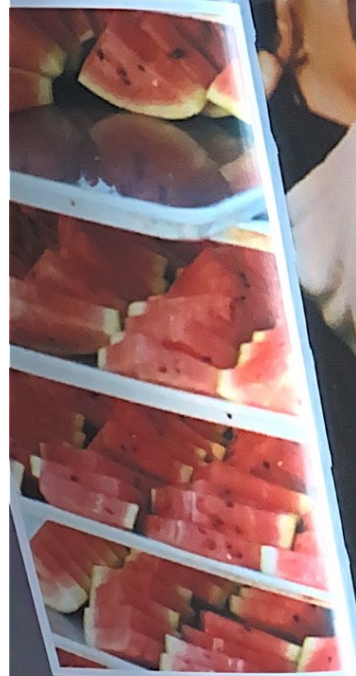

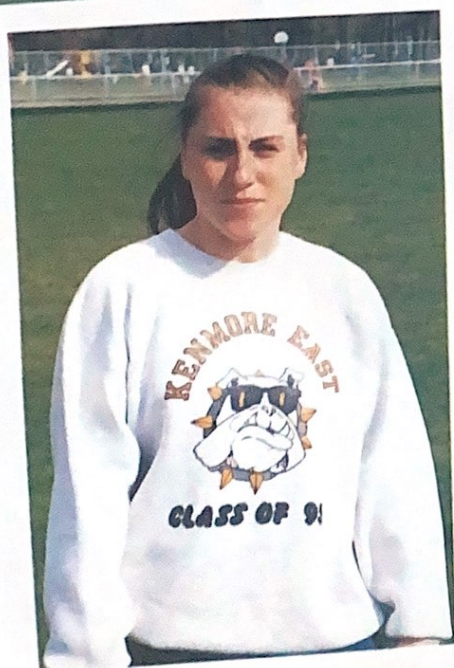

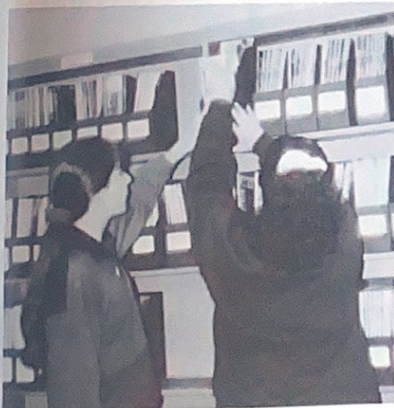

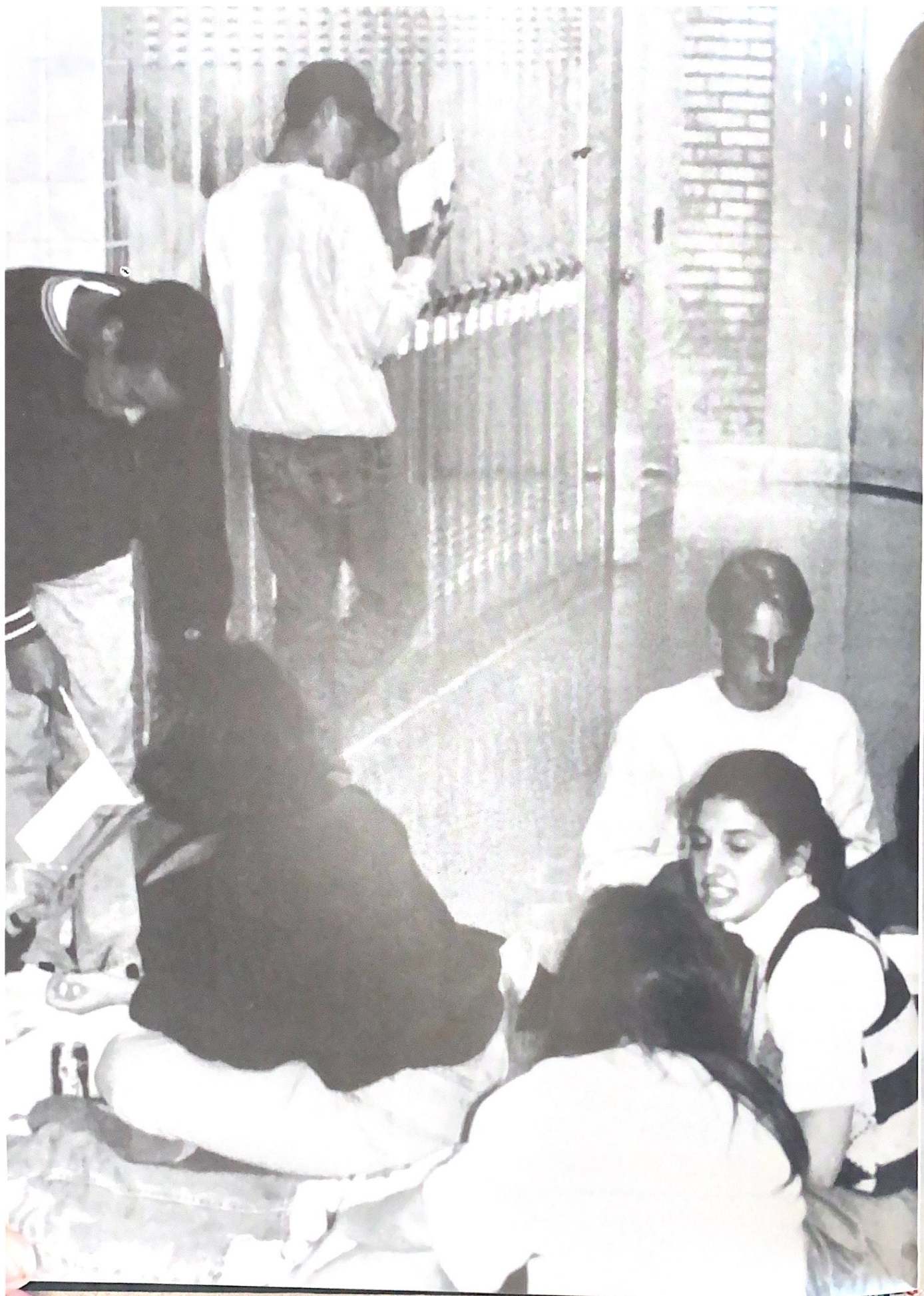

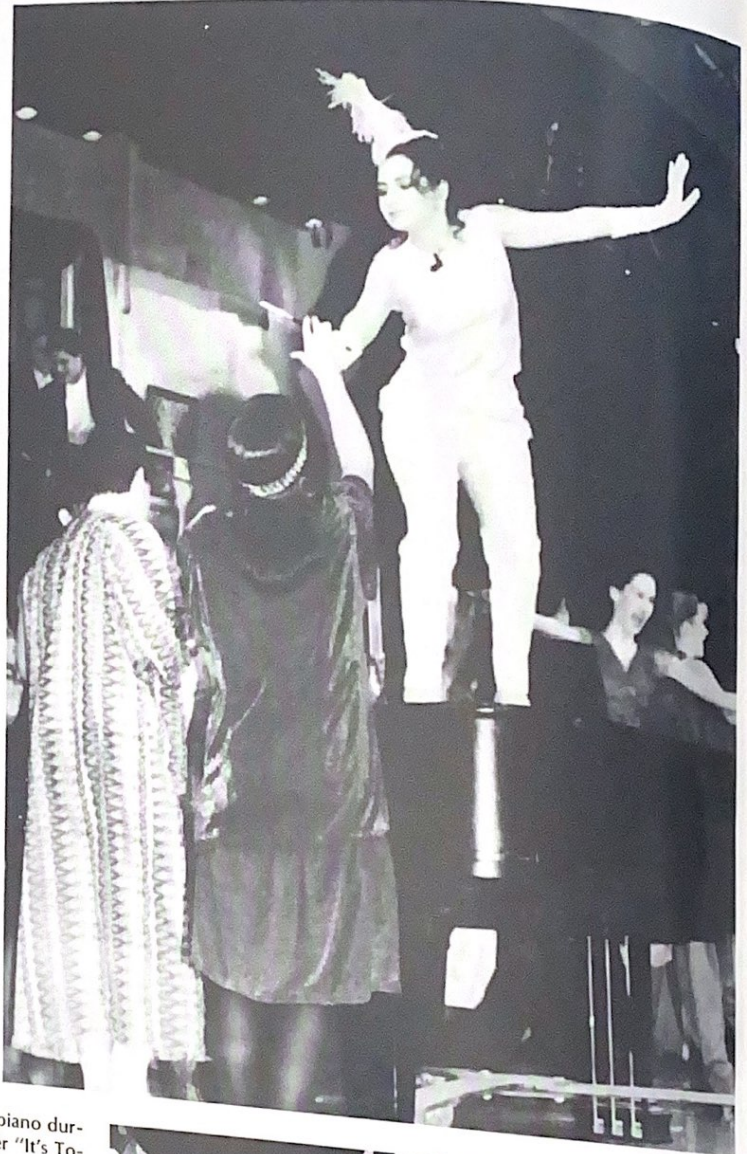

The Art of Stage Crew

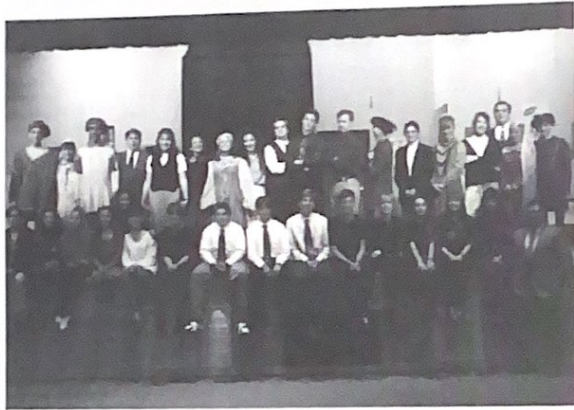

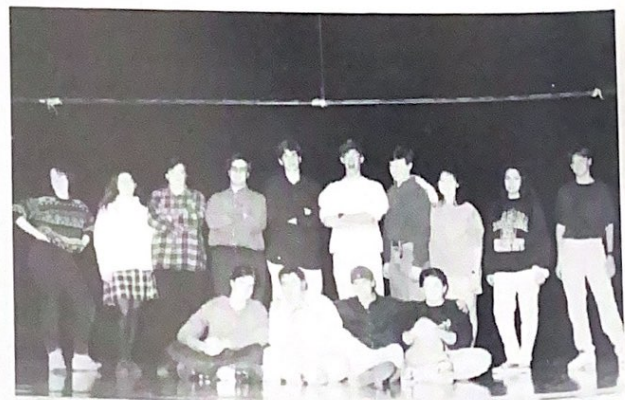
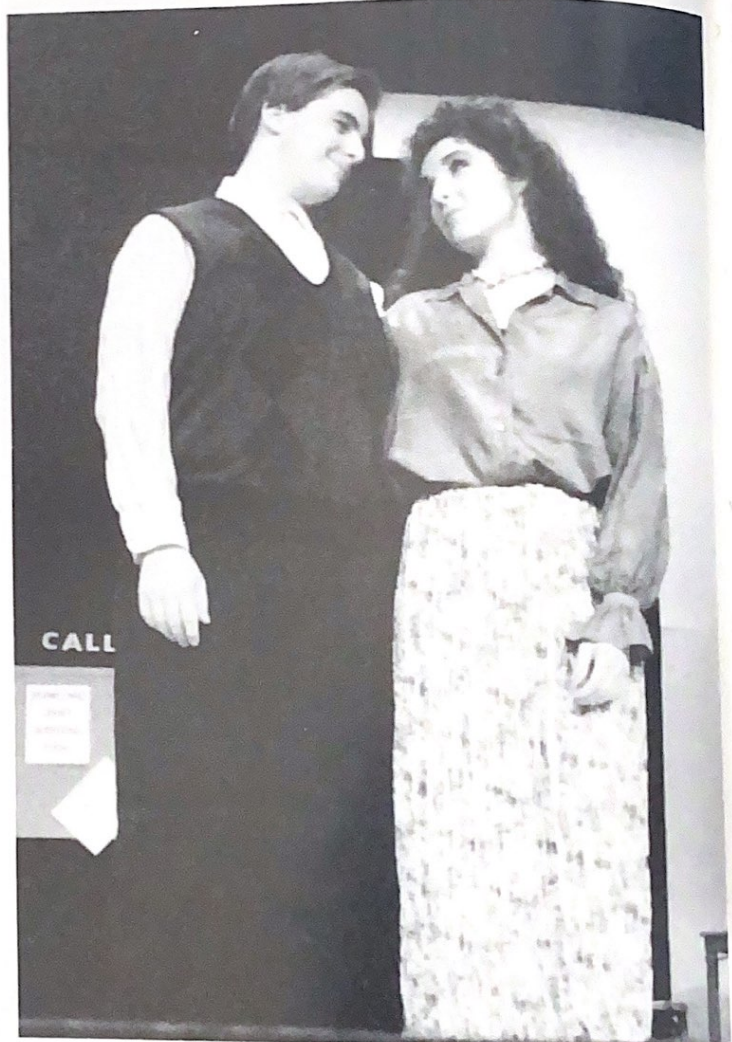

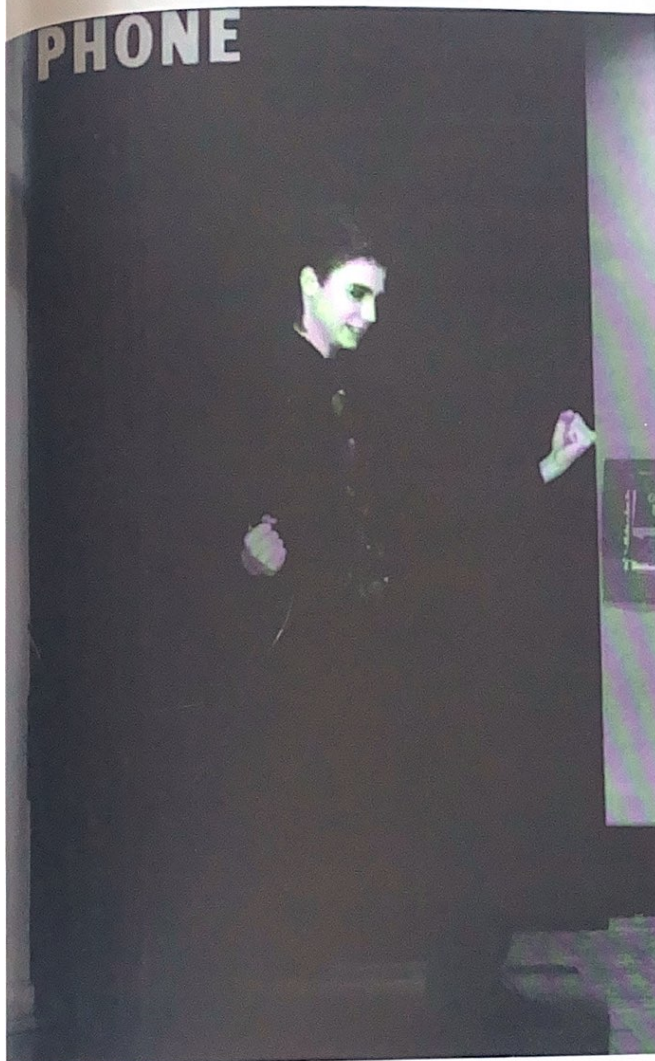
