NEW ACCOUNTABILITY DESIGNATIONS RELEASED

We were pleased to learn that the Ken-Ton School District and all of its schools have been given the "Local Support & Improvement" (LSI) designation by New York State, which was previously referred to as "Good Standing." It is the highest designation a school district can receive under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). ESSA was adopted by Congress in 2015, replacing the No Child Left Behind Act, and governs federal K-12 public education policy throughout the country. Under New York State's ESSA plan, schools and districts are now identified as one of the following:

Schools:

- Local Support & Improvement (LSI): These schools are considered to be in "good standing." Continuous improvement is driven by the district.
- Targeted Support & Improvement (TSI): These are schools that are identified as needing improvement in at least one student subgroup and receive support from NYSED.
- Additional Targeted Support & Improvement (ATSI): These are schools that are identified as needing an additional level of support from NYSED.
- Comprehensive Support & Improvement (CSI): These are schools that are identified as needing comprehensive support from NYSED.

Districts:

- Local Support & Improvement (LSI): These districts are considered to be in "good standing." Continuous improvement is driven by the district.
- Target Districts: These are districts which have at least one school identified as TSI, ATSI or CSI, or any district-wide subgroup that meets the identification criteria for two years in a row.

For the 2022-23 school year, these designations are based on the following measures: student academic achievement, progress of English language learners, chronic absenteeism, graduation rates, and measures of college, career and civic readiness. Beginning next year, designations will also be based on student growth, academic progress, college, career and civic readiness, and out-of-school suspensions. These different measures are examined in each of 10 different "subgroups," which are categories of students based on race/ethnicity, English language proficiency, disability status, and economic status.

This is all part of the new system of school and district accountability being implemented in New York State. Accountability is an extremely important part of our educational system. It results in improved student achievement by identifying areas where additional help may be needed. It tells us as educators how we can provide additional support or

use different strategies to make sure every student is achieving his or her full potential. It also allows us to most efficiently allocate limited resources to have the greatest impact on students.

Gr. 3-8 NYS assessments and Regents Exams are factors that impact a school or district's accountability designation and test participation can have an impact on a school or district's overall performance. Over the past few years, we have seen significant improvements in NYS testing. Tests are no longer timed and the testing window was shortened from three days to two days. Additionally, accommodations have been facilitated for students with disabilities and computer-based testing has been implemented. New York State has also implemented new graduation pathway options which have given students greater flexibility in which exams they are required to take.

It is important to note that there were school-level and district-level subgroups which were identified as being in need of improvement, based on the 21-22 school year results. Improving in these areas will be a priority to ensure that we maintain LSI designations. We will continue to strive for improvement in each of these measures across all subgroups.
