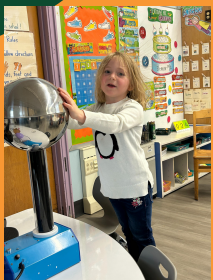
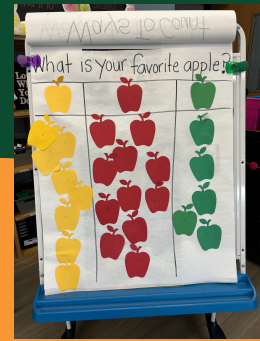

The Elementary Health teacher will be visiting Hoover this October. This first lesson is full of fun and engaging activities on what it means to be healthy and explore healthy habits. Our health lessons always begin with exercise, and for this lesson, we will get up and move in coordination with the Bills Shout song! Our younger learners will then learn about healthy habits through books, sorting activities, and identifying healthy vs unhealthy habits. Our older learners will complete self inventories of their physical, social, and mental health habits and evaluate the results. Students will be asked to pick a habit to work and improve upon. Some review games will be played to better understand healthy habits and all lessons will conclude with a mindful breathing exercise!

Kindergartners and 1st graders have learned how to pick partners and sing in a nice soft voice. We have learned many new songs in which we get to play egg shakers, jingle taps, sand blocks and drums! We have had many parades and have gotten to use puppets. We are now singing Halloween songs and learning how to play the bells.



3rd graders are deep in the process of learning how to play the recorder. We have learned our first three notes: B, A and G. We are learning to put our left hand on top and our right hand on the bottom, how to breathe through our mouth and not our nose, tongue the notes, read the rhythms and notes on the staff. We are playing 5 songs so far. Establishing good practicing habits of 10 minutes a day is ensuring capable musicians!
