

If approved, this project will be funded primarily through New York State Education Department Building Aid, with additional funding from the district's capital reserve. Capital Project Priorities & Investments

The Capital Project encompasses the following proposed priorities and investments at Hoover Elementary & Middle School:

- A six-classroom addition on the elementary school side of the building, which will address the need for additional classroom space at both the elementary and middle school (the elementary school currently utilizes space on the middle school side of the building)
- New parent pick-up/drop-off to enhance safety and address traffic concerns during arrival/dismissal
- Renovations and upgrades to both middle school gymnasiums (large and small gymnasium)
- Reconstruction of parking lots and sidewalks
- Renovations for a more secured Single Point of Entry
- Replacement of drinking water pipes to maximize water quality
- Partial roof replacement (middle school side of building)
- New single-occupant unisex restrooms (middle school side of building)
- New "Baker"-style pool drains to enhance swimmer safety at middle school pool
