Dear Educator:

WANT TO HELP THE LESS FORTUNATE IN **YOUR OWN** AREA?

Every first Friday of February since 1988, a group of employees known as **E**ducators **T**otally **C**ommitted (E. T. C.) has addressed the *ongoing* needs of the poor with *ongoing* efforts. E. T. C. emphasizes a three-point program of <u>awareness</u>, <u>commitment</u>, and <u>action</u>. Our focus is to make our school communities <u>aware</u> of people in need, show that we are <u>committed</u> to help them, and take <u>action</u>.

WHAT WE DO

School personnel in both the Kenmore-Town of Tonawanda and the Clarence school districts call public attention to the plight of the less fortunate. We involve students in a socially-relevant project, and raise funds for organizations which care for the poor in the Western New York area.

We do this by sponsoring an annual sleepout to collect donations of cash, food, clothing, personal care and household items.

Sleeping out means staying outdoors in cardboard refrigerator boxes and obtaining <u>as many sponsors as possible</u> that pledge cash donations for the 10-hour event. This sleepout engages students from grades K-12, as well as teachers and staff, in this program of social awareness. Students participate in a manner appropriate to their grade level. This extends from making contributions to support the activity to actually sleeping out. The first Friday of February is designated because of the sharp drop in charitable donations after the holiday season.

All donations are given to those in need. To date, about \$1,010,000.00 dollars have been collected and distributed to those in need. *Nothing* goes for administrative costs. **Every penny collected is given to the less fortunate.**

WHAT YOU CAN DO

E.T.C.'s **immediate** aim is to see New York State public, private and parochial schools-as well as colleges and universities--participate in similar programs. Our **long-range** goal is to have schools in *other states and countries* do the same. The impact that schools *throughout the world* could have would be immense. Imagine! Students and school personnel worldwide would come together on this day to help those in need <u>IN THEIR</u> OWN COMMUNITIES.

The event can be <u>any</u>thing that would encourage teachers, administrators, librarians, secretaries, counselors, security personnel, custodians, transportation employees, aides, students, and their families to come together in a common effort to help people:

Athletic-a-thon Dance Pizza party
Bowling party Ice cream social Pool party
Canned food drive Movie Sleepout

Car wash Penny drive Spaghetti dinner

If your district / school already has activities in place which help those in need, would it be possible to schedule at least one of those activities on the first Friday of February? The combined effect of school communities throughout the world participating in an activity of their choosing <u>ON THE SAME DAY</u> would be significant. Wouldn't it be inspiring if, at some future point in time, the first Friday of February would be designated by the United Nations as . . .

A WORLDWIDE SCHOOLDAY TO HELP PEOPLE IN NEED

This is E.T.C.'s goal.
